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Educational Affairs Plan 2020-2023

- Updates provided annually to faculty and administration
- Last fall, nearly all major Ed Affairs Plan (2017-2019) initiatives under way, operationalized, or researched and removed/replaced
- In 2019, an updated Ed Affairs Plan for 2020-2023 developed and aligned with the college's updated strategic plan



Create a data-informed, student-focused system for course schedule development; New process implemented for fall 2019 credit schedule

- Developed program and degree pathways showing the optimal sequence of courses to help students reduce time to completion
 - Taskforce and faculty developed pathways; Deans created sample schedules
 - Pathways, sample schedules based on pathways, and a guaranteed to run (G2R) list of courses posted on the website
 - LatinX Studies (concentration) draft pathway created for 2019-2020; Included as a "guaranteed schedule"



Create a data-informed, student-focused system for course schedule development

 In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, adjustments made in summer for the Fall 2020 credit schedule to accommodate varying needs of programs and students
