Review and approval of OAC Assessment Manual	Liaisons	20 minutes	It was decided that changes still need to be made to the manual. Kathleen shared that the definitions do not align with the definitions in the Curriculum Council Manual. It was decided that the terminology should be moved to the bottom more like a glossary and the assessment cycle with annual instructions be moved after the introduction in the manual. 			 2. Curriculum Mapping Short presentation with time to map the course faculty are assessing for the year afterwards. The mapping will assist us with assessing across courses and modalities. It was recommended that OAC participate and provide support in this session by being assigned in rooms to help facilitate other faculty in this process. To prepare for fall faculty development days, the session will be put together by the next meeting to share with the OAC. All OAC members will complete the mapping exercise. Moving Forward with Curriculum Mapping	Liaisons	20 Minutes	Blooms taxonomy: For our Curriculum maps, we ask faculty to articulate the levels of blooms taxonomy for each course outcome. Currently we do not have any guidelines as to the blooms levels of learning expected in our individual courses. We discussed if we should have higher levels of learning in our 200 level courses, or for courses requiring prerequisites. Kathleen shared that this would be a good project for the future, but as we get started, this will be a good exercise to survey existing levels of learning. Kathleen stated that the online section of the map is for a future Quality Matters which is a set of standards used to evaluate the design of online and blended courses (it is assessment, but relates to course structure). This section in the curriculum maps is not required. It will be used only for courses that are working on a QM design of their course shells.	
Moving Forward with Assessment of Institutional Learning Outcomes	Liaisons	20 Minutes	Kathleen stated that the goal is to assess at least one ILO in each course. We would also like all faculty to be assessing that same ILO in the course. (Example: Psychology 100 selects critical thinking, all sections of Psychology 100 would asses critical thinking.) Eventually, all selected ILOs will need to be updated on the course outlines in CurricUNET, our official curriculum source. This will	

			help us move forward on assessing across courses, modalities, including dual credit.	
Development of Boot Camp	Liaisons	20 minutes	It was discussed that the Boot Camp was intended as a primary resource for new OAC members and would be good for new faculty too. New faculty are encouraged to complete the ACUE course which takes a year. The boot camp isn't designed to replace ACUE but to be a shorter – 10-15 minutes per topic, training to assist faculty. Additional resources will be included for faculty to explore topics further if they are interested.
