BIO 103 Human Biology Laboratory 1.0 sem hrs 0 lec/ 2 lab (withdrawal course)

Effective date: Fall 2022

Rational: BIO 103 was effective and first offered in SP 2010, and it was last offered in SP 2015. When it was offered, the enrollment was low, and the course was often cancelled. The accompanying lecture course BIO 102 is a viable online course offering with consistent offerings and enrollments. The lab, as currently structured, no longer meets IAI criteria and significant work would be needed to restructure for compliance. Given the financial and work force resources required to offer a lab course, the division no longer feels that BIO 103 is a viable offering.

*Impact*: This course is not a prerequisite or co-requisite for any courses so there will be no additional course impact.
