Without integrated outcomes, the big picture can become fuzzy to the point of being lost. Think for a moment of Georges Seurat's *A Sunday at La Grande Jatte*. A course is one dot, a program is one figure, and life is the full picture. If one dot is out of place or the wrong color, the picture would be less impressive. Maybe it wouldn't support the figure. If the figure isn't as it should be, the whole is not in focus.

Our task is to ensure that each dot fulfills its role and supports the figure it helps to compose. A strong figure can walk out into the workplace or transfer to a four-year institution to continue adding dots. This makes that person stronger and better able to meet their goals in the world. Integrating outcomes from the modular level to the institutional level keeps the picture in focus. We look forward to being your guide in this process and learning from all the amazing subject matter experts here at Waubonsee. It really does take a collaborative team to map and ultimately assess curricular outcomes.
