**Minor Course Revision:** Originator – Vicky Archos

*Rationale:* Language to course objectives and course outcomes cleaned up to eliminate redundancy. Per data collection over the years, it was decided to update institutional learning outcomes and required text to more fully align with Oral Communication.

**DECISION for COM100:**

Archos mentioned the course objectives and outcomes were updated to remove redundancy. The institutional learning outcome was updated to emphasize oral communication. The required textbook was updated to the latest edition. Rainboldt raised a question about the textbook update for dual credit courses. Stepney confirmed that a one-year grace period for high schools using older editions had been a past practice as long as there were no significant differences between them.

Chavis moved for a motion to vote on this minor course revision for COM100. Theobald so moved and Cofield seconded the motion. A vote was called and passed. These course revisions will be **effective Fall 2026**.
